Funding Allocation

The government has provided Sports Premium funding for the academic year 2020-21 to provide additional and sustainable improvements to PE and sport for the benefit of all primary pupils and to encourage the development of healthy and active life styles. Challenges

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted our ability to provide swimming for all of primary pupils, due to national and local restrictions. We were unable to access off-site visits, and therefore the local swimming pool. All pupils in primary (for the academic year) and Key Stage 3 (on rotation) will have access to swimming lessons in 2021 – 2022 to address this area, and confirm that pupils are able to meet the minimum requirements, irrespective of the pandemic, as soon as possible.

Not all funding was used this academic year and in line with guidance has been brought forward to 2021 – 2022.

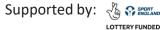

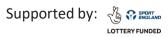
