This week in Primary

Primary have been exploring number in Maths and writing book reviews in English.

We have been looking at fair trade in PSHE and the life of coco farmers in Ghana. We have been exploring human rights and looking at the rule of law in our tutor times.

For topic we have started exploring human rights and the significance of Rosa Parks to the movement.

The Designated Safeguarding Lead at Thames Valley School is Becca Archer who has been doing this role for over 10 years in different settings, ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all those she has worked with. The role is to take the responsibility for safeguarding and child protection, including online safety within the school.

This role involves managing referrals, working with children's services, training staff and supporting them to carry out their safeguarding duties. She works to ensure all record keeping is up to date and accurate for each individual pupil and supports staff to preventing abuse and recognise the signs that a pupil may be in distress, allowing them time and space to share their views and experiences.

In addition, the role also includes supporting families who may be finding situations challenging at home. This could involve working in collaboration with family support, youth services, attendance support workers, alternative provisions, parenting support, respite care, police, other schools, Doctors, CAMHS, etc.

Whilst this is a huge part of the job role, there is more within this which ensures and enables the safety of all pupils who attend Thames Valley School. The DSL also has responsibility for pupil attendance and, if a pupil is finding it difficult to access their school day, it is Becca's duty to explore why this is and offer the right support or signpost to the correct services so that the pupil can access school. Becca works closely with the Transdisciplinary Team reviewing behaviour, support plans and offering support to different interventions and accessing outside services when needed.

Any trips that leave the school site are coordinated with her to confirm all safeguarding measures have been put in place and that the provision is suitable for those attending. This involves carrying out a thorough risk assessment on the trip itself, reviewing the provision's health and safety protocols, as well as ensuring all staff attending have received appropriate training to be able to ensure this goes ahead safely.

Becca is completing her Trauma Informed Diploma and will be using this to upskill the staff and support the pupils at the school. Becca offers support for parents and carers and, if you have any concerns about something that happens both inside or outside of school, Becca can offer support with this. She is also able to look at local offers, services and clubs in your area for your young people to access, if you would like. 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Updates from the Senior Leadership Team

This week has seen Miss Archer participating in vital NSPCC training regarding her role as Designated Safeguarding Lead, refreshing and updating her knowledge of Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023, and ensuring she is best equipped to support all staff in keeping each other, and our pupils, safe in school.

Mrs Dudgeon has been busy across the school, collating progress data in English, Maths and Science from all primary and Key Stage 3 pupils, ensuring next half term's lesson planning builds on what the pupils already know. This provides vital support to teachers, encouraging a deeper understanding as to pupils' individual next steps.

Miss Mallon has been kept busy leading Primary this week and she has been ensuring all risk assessments and checks have been completed, ready to restart Primary swimming lessons very soon. She's looking forward to getting back in the pool too, although she's hoping for not too much splashing!

In the office this week, Mrs Saunders has been ensuring plans are in place for parents' evening on 12th October and has been booking appointments for all parents and carers; please expect to receive responses to your requests early next week.

Mrs Buley has been carrying out appraisals with the Senior Leadership Team and teachers, supporting their reflective practice and target setting for the year ahead! She was also accompanied by Miss Galloway on her learning walk this week, and it was fantastic to see what the pupils have been getting up to and hear from them how they feel the school year is progressing.

Next week we welcome some visitors to the school. The last few weeks have gone by so quickly and, on 11th October, Dr Nic Crossley, CEO of Liberty Academy Trust, will be carrying out her monthly visit with us. We're really looking forward to showing her what we have been up to, and she will be joined this time by her Executive Assistant, Harriet, who is leading on the Trust wide Equality, Diversity and Inclusion strategy.

On 12th October, three representatives from Autism Education Trust will be in school, shadowing members of staff and completing reflective sessions with us to help us to continue to improve our Autism specific practice. They will be looking at two specific areas - understanding the individual and enabling environments - on this visit, helping us to guide our future plans and CPD.
