
Student council discussed their writing experiences at school. This included recognising possible barriers to writing and suggesting ways to encourage writing at TVS.



Students gave positive feedback on the 'Big Write'. Students explained that it encourages imagination and creativity as well as being a great opportunity for them to practice their handwriting, grammar, vocabulary and punctuation skills.

- · working with technology






This included:

- Tutor times- students take part in multiple different activities during this time including SaLT, First News and Newsround, and learning about current celebrations and days of recognition, such as, Women's History Month this month and celebrating science week!
- <u>Club times-</u> Clubs give students an opportunity to socialise during structured activities such as games club and crochet club. These activities can also help develop OT and SaLT skills.





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This week, pupils have been using comic strips to create story maps during speech and language sessions. Story maps support pupils with practising memory skills, organising their thoughts and then communicating a sequence of events.




Some primary pupils have been doing McDonalds pretend play while practising understanding and using conjunctions and prepositions in everyday interactions.
